New Service 'Designated FAA Agent' Launches to Help Foreign Pilots Meet FAA Compliance Deadline

Online portal streamlines designation of U.S. agents for overseas pilots and aircraft owners ahead of July 7, 2025 FAA deadline

Beaverton, Oregon – May 1, 2025 – DFA – Designated FAA Agent, an online aviation compliance service, today announced the launch of its new user portal that enables foreign pilots and aircraft owners to designate a U.S. agent for service of process in minutes. The service is designed to help international certificate holders comply with the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) latest requirements under Advisory Circular AC 3-1, which mandate appointing a U.S. agent by the upcoming July 7, 2025 deadline.

Under a final rule adopted by the FAA in late 2024, any individual with a foreign address who holds or applies for an FAA certificate, rating, or authorization must designate a U.S. agent to receive official FAA documents on their behalf. This rule affects an estimated 115,000 aviation professionals, including pilots, mechanics, and aircraft owners living outside the U.S. DFA's platform is designed for fast, affordable compliance:

- Users can register in minutes through a clean, intuitive dashboard
- Real-time email alerts ensure no FAA correspondence is missed
- Pricing is competitive, with users able to receive \$10 credit for every successful subscription using their unique referral code
